Directions to the Egan Science Center at Northeastern University:

Via the Green Line: take the Green Line (E-Arborway) to Northeastern University T stop. Cross Huntington Avenue (over the tracks) and walk up Forsyth Street into the Northeastern campus. Egan is at the end of the long block, on your left, just before the Orange Line T.

Via the Orange Line: take the Orange Line to Ruggles T stop. Follow signs to Northeastern. Upon exiting the station Egan is on your right.
